

Reclaiming Our Place in the Community

Branding is the name given by public ··· relations and business gurus to "staking a

claim to your name" as a group, business, or any organization. For example, soft drink logos such as Coca-Cola, Pepsi or Dr. Pepper immediately identify or brand their product. Similarly, the United Methodist Church is easily recognized by our Cross and Flame. So we identify as a UM church by placing our name, Wesley, alongside that symbol (or logo). We also, a few years ago, adopted this tag line: "Open hearts, Open minds, Open doors: We are the people of the United Methodist Church."

With GRACE as the identifying word Methodists have expounded and expanded since John Wesley unintentionally started our flavor of church in the late 1790s, I'm thinking of seeing Wesley as A Grace Place. The United Methodist Women (UMW) of Wesley UMC assembled 50 Health Kits for UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief). The Kits were taken to the East District Meeting of UMW on September 24. The Kits will be taken to the annual North Texas Conference UMW meeting on October 15. Then the Kits will be sent to UMCOR.

Relief-supply kits help provide care for the most vulnerable people during times of crisis. UMCOR collects 6 types of kits for global distribution and cleaning buckets for US distribution after storms. Kits help sustain everyday life for people who lack ready access to essential supplies.

UMW would like to thank those in the congregation who contributed supplies for the kits or those who gave money to be sent along with the kits for the purchase of toothpaste. Together, we can make a difference!

The Wesley UMC Thank Offering

Annually, the United Methodist Women receive what is called "The World Thank Offering" which are gifts each member gives, with thanksgiving and gratitude, cel-

ebrating being a child of God. This offering highlights the first meeting of each new UMW church year.*

To celebrate our shared ministries at Wesley and to show support for these ministries to children, youth, families, missions, new church starts, etc., your Finance Committee boldly asks for your participation in the "Wesley UMC Thank Offering." This offering, like all of our giving to the church, is voluntary. Here is the idea we are suggesting:

Beginning Sunday, October 2, 2016 and continuing through December 30, 2016, each adult member will put aside \$1 per day. At the end of the year, on December 30, each member will have accumulated \$90 for his/her Thank Offering. Together, we ill give \$90 x (times) each participant to say Thanks! for giving me the opportunity to express the "vow of service" through giving.
