Palm Sunday April 9, 2017- Commemorates the Triumphal entry of Jesus into It is described in all four Jerusalem. canonical gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John). The crowds shouted praises and waved palm branches.

Holy Monday, Holy Tuesday, Holy Wednesday April 10, 11 and 12 - The last days of Jesus' life as described in the Gospels.

Holy Thursday (Maundy Thursday) April 13 The Last Supper that Jesus shared with his Apostles is commemorated. Jesus lays out the model for Holy Communion. Matthew 26:26-29 Mark 14:22-25 Luke 22:14-20

Good Friday - April 14 Commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus and his subsequent death. The Church mourns for Christ's death, reveres the Cross, and marvels at His life for His obedience until death.

#### Easter Memories

An old saying goes, "Some things change; some things stay the same." A guick look at a photo of yourself just one year ago will tell you: "Wow, I have changed!" It could be the ageing process we all go through (whether we like it or not!), the style or color of our hair (enough said), or that weight which can go up or down. (Yuk!)

In my mind as I write, I see a picture of my oldest brother, Eddie, my sister, Becky, and me adorned in our Easter clothes either before or after church. Knowing the capacity of children to guickly look a bit untidy after new clothes are put on and hair parted, combed, or brushed, I'd opt for before church. As I recall, I even sported a little hat to add "pop" to my Easter outfit. Besides the beginning of the school year when all of us received either Sears & Roebuck or J.C. Penney catalogue clothes, Easter was the one other time I remember receiving new clothes from my parents. As you know, all of us boys and girls looked our best before, during, and right after church. It was always fun to even enjoy the Easter egg hunt in those clothes before our parents would say, "Okay. It's time to change clothes and save those nice Sunday-go-to-meeting digs!"

At least in my family, Easter Sunday and most other Sundays, we made the 15-20 mile trip from our house in Princeton to Papa and Grandma Cook's in the country for Sunday dinner, burr-cut, haircuts, and playing with our four cousins. Easter Sunday dinner always featured ham, but also chicken, 4-6 vegetables, tailor-made Jell-o for each grandchild (and fruit cocktail in most, cornbread and biscuits, and both cakes and pies. The grandchildren sat at their table while the adults sat at theirs. Mommas mad sure each of their children had full plates before they sat down to eat. Of course, each meal was preceded by a blessing given by my dad; as I recall, he was the only one I ever heard pray!

I mention those notorious burr haircuts. Papa was the barber for all of the men and boys in the Cook family. I was never asked how I wanted my hair cut until I was in the fourth or fifth grade. When I asked, Dad started taking me to a local barbershop and he had to pay for it! I am glad to report that this family trait has never been passed down the family line so my son, Matt, never had to endure the burr cut. And yet, if you could see a picture of my 40-year-old, Teaching Tennis Pro son in Frisco, you would note he shaves his head, but still sports a beard. Because of the way my ears stood out after the burr cuts, my older brother started calling me "Flaps." Enough said on that.

Through the humiliation of burr cuts, being called that nickname, and putting up with my cousins, I never forgot the real meaning of Easter. It was always made clear by my dad, my Sunday school teachers, and my pastors. It was the day Jesus arose from the grave! We sang "Up from the Grave He Arose, as well as "He Lives." The church choir punctuated Easter always with a "special." Of course, all of us, children and adults, were honoring God with the best of our wardrobes/clothes. Nothing but the finest for Jesus on His Sunday! Front and center, the Crucifixion on Friday faded in comparison to the Risen Christ, Savior and Lord, on Easter Sunday. I knew, in my heart, it was a divine moment, although I never fully understood ALL that it meant. And in some ways, I still don't, but I trust any doubt I have to God in Christ! Precious memories, indeed.


