

#### Breaking Bread Together and What If?

<sup>2</sup> Well, dinner's on twice a week at Wesley UMC beginning Monday, October 2! We'll be Breaking Bread Together with anyone who desires to join us at noon each Monday and Friday in our kitchen/dining area we call, rightly so, Wesley Hall! For our older, membership church, it is a "service of love" we want to share with our neighbors and those who lives closest to us in our "parish!" All of us who will work are servants: planners, cookers, greeters, speakers, servers, and custodians. Our service mirrors the words of Jesus in Matthew 25:37-40.

"Master, what are you talking about? When did we ever see You hungry and feed You, thirsty and give You a drink? And when did we ever see You sick or in prison and come to You? Then King Jesus will say, "I'm telling the solemn truth; Whenever you did one of these things to someone overlooked or ignored, that was Me--you did it to Me'"

At Breaking Bread Together, each servant will be the hands, the heart, the feet and the voice of Jesus, also known as the Suffering Servant. What can you do? Invite and bring with you a neighbor, friend, family member, or even a complete stranger. Our hope is to "feed both the stomach and the soul!"

This will come as no surprise to those who know me best: I love books! I love to read, especially what younger ministers and creative churches are doing in the name of our Lord Jesus. Writer, Pastor, Mark Batterson of the National Community Church in Washington, D.C., has become a source of inspiration and encouragement to me. I've read 5-6 of his books and am currently reading <u>If: Trading Your If Only Regrets for God's</u> <u>What If Possibilities.</u> Like Max Lucado before him, Mark can say in so few words what most of us can't say in a lifetime! "If only..."

<u>If</u> is a series of challenges to be read one day at a time, by oneself or in a group. At the end of each chapter, Mark tightly words the gist of each chapter. So:

- 1. What if you were one decision away from a totally different life?
- 2. What if you rejected everything about God what wasn't God and accepted Him for who He is--God for you?
- 3. What if you started acting like an agent of grace--looking for opportunities to love people when they least expect it and least deserve it?
- 4. What if you tuned out the voice of condemnation and turned in to the voice of conviction?
- 5. What if you tried a food fast, media fast, or complaining fast for ten, twenty one, or forty days?

This is Day 5 for me meaning I have 25 more days to "digest this book!" Yum!

From the sublime to the mundane, but important information.

- 1. Compared to one year ago, we've done better on paying our apportionments. On the other hand, our giving to our General Fund has declined significantly.
- 2. To keep up with increased costs for our Backpack Buddy program which, by the way, targets children with hunger needs at Como-Pickton and North Hopkins Elementary Schools, we announced last Sunday an increase of \$1/week, from \$15 to \$16 per month. We receive, free, food from the North Texas Food Bank to feed children at Travis Primary School. (Our only cost if the trip to Duncanville and back once in the fall and once in the spring.)
- 3. To begin our Breaking Bread Together ministry, you have been generous, some of our organizations have been (i.e., UMW), and this ministry is growing.
- 4. Our Wednesday Night Meal gathering continues to flourish, thanks to our Fellowship Committee's leadership. Our meal rotations are very well received ! (And monies continue to support this "outreach ministry.")
- 5. Work with the finest staff I've ever had. I can honestly say of them: They are overworked and underpaid! Whenever you feel led to say thanks to them in some tangible way. Let me encourage you to do so!


