



Advent and Christmas

The season of Advent, which comes from the Latin word adventus meaning "coming" or "visit," begins four Sundays before Christmas and ends on Christmas Eve. Advent is the beginning of the liturgical year for Christians.

Although we are accustomed to celebrating Christmas on a single day, in both Christian tradition and on the Church calendar, the Christmas season lasts sundown on December 24 (Christmas Eve) through Epiphany of the Lord (January 6). This is sometimes popularly referred to as "the twelve days of Christmas."

What happens during Advent?

During the season of Advent, Christians across the world prepare for the celebration of the arrival of the Lord into the world through the birth of his Son Jesus Christ. Advent is a time to celebrate light in the midst of darkness. It is also a time to look forward to when Jesus will come a second time.

The beginning of Advent is when the preparations for Christmas really begin - the festive menu is planned, gifts are chosen and wrapped, carols sung, cards are written and posted and houses decorated.

History of Advent

In the 5th Century, Advent began on 11 November (St Martin's Day) and took the form of a six week fast leading to Christmas. During the 6th century, Advent was reduced to its current length and later the fasting was dropped.



Breaking Bread Together Ministry (BBTM) Update

Because of your faithful response, Wesley's new vital food ministry, known as Breaking Bread Together, continues to make major thrusts into our community (parish) in providing two meals per week primarily for those who may not otherwise receive adequate nourish-

ment.

In October, our first month of service, BBTM provided 495 lunches and in November, 430 lunches for a two-month total of 925 meals. We are now preparing to take this ministry to the next level with another mailing in our parish area in hopes of growing our ministry to those needing this nourishment. Because you have demonstrated your support of BBTM, we are anticipating growing it to a possible need of 150-200 meals each time we serve!

We have in place an excellent volunteer staff of servants, most of whom have pledged to serve any day--any job and who consider their ministry to be nothing less than a labor of love. With this staff and your continued support, God will continue to be glorified in Wesley United Methodist Church. 

From the Pastor

The Joy of Serving!

We're entering the final month of 2017 and I'm saying to myself, "How can that be?" Like several of you, I was just getting

used to the 2017 date as I wrote, checks, notes, texts, FB postings, and e-mails! Time flies when you're having fun; i.e. working, going to school, and even waiting for Christmas!!

As I noted in last week's message, this Sunday, December 3, is not only the first Sunday of Advent, but also the beginning of another Christian year. And Advent in Christian churches like ours is observed as a time of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus at Christmas. It is from the Latin word meaning "coming."

So, my important job is to tell you while we "see ahead on Christmas Day," we are to enter this time waiting, watching, hoping, expecting for the coming of the Christ child once again through the eyes of Mary and Joseph, the shepherds, the wise men, and all the anticipation written in Luke, chapters one and two and Matthew, chapters one and two. That's right. The most significant event in Christianity occurs in only four chapters of our Bible--and not all of some of those chapters! It is true that several Prophetic passages point to the birth of Jesus--and the theme-line in the Bible ultimately points to Jesus of Nazareth. So, while we are "in the meantime..." until Christmas Eve, we, like Mary, the Mother of Jesus," ponder the wonder" coming again soon!

For parents with children of all ages, I suggest an Advent Calendar as a way to teach them, and you, the power of waiting and expectation. In our world driven by 24/7 news bytes, discounts at stores, Black Fridays (oops: I almost typed bleak Fridays!), Cyber Mondays, and Giving Tuesdays, is it any wonder we have issues with waiting, expecting, or anticipating? And with all the publicity focused on parades, Santa rides, ice sculptures, concerts, etc. (and all are good--but how much is too much?), then our church tradition says to tell the believers to slow down, be watchful and waiting, for the Christ is coming again (Advent). We have not mentioned decorating, the cooking, the baking, the gift wrapping, the house cleaning, etc. Whew! Or is that "ouch!"

So, buy an Advent Calendar, an Advent devotional guide, or read good books like The Gift of the Magi or watch A Christmas Carol together as a family and mark the time within the safety and comfort of your homes. Truly, it may be the best gift you'll ever give to one another as a family.

Many thanks to Mary Lou Foster, Carol Ann O'dell, and Gary Lewis for guiding Wesley through its annual Fall Roundup. We raised around \$7000 to enable our children

and youth to go to summer camps and our church to offer Vacation Bible School in 2018. As these are non-budgeted items, it is necessary to assist in these important and lifechanging ministries.

Our annual Thanksgiving meal was festive and very well-attended. Truthfully, it was a feast! I know this is a collaborative effort on the part of all our adult Sunday school classes. So, many thanks to all!

We completed and turned in our Charge Conference materials at the annual district-wide gathering on Sunday, November 19. Apportionment-wise, we are still about two apportionments short (approximately \$4700) to pay out fully. Core leadership will have discussed this matter by the time you receive this newsletter. Just remember: every dollar counts and all dollars will go to ministry here in our district, our conference, and throughout the world!

I'm rejoicing in being numbered with the Breaking Bread Together servants! I cannot tell you the laughter and hard work this team of servants bring to our kitchen every Monday and Friday from 8:00 a.m. - 1:e0 p.m. You'll find an article in this newsletter from that servant team! And to those of you who haven given monetary support, God bless you! And we're getting better and hope to feed even more beginning this month and into the new year.

August 25, 2018 will mark the 50th anniversary of my calling and licensing to the Christian ministry. I certainly had no idea what I was doing or getting into! My pastoring and preaching has taken me to many churches in many places, at home and abroad. I've moved several times, married and buried a whole bunch of people, and yes, even stumbled along the way. "I know not what the future hold, but I know who holds my future. So, "waiting and waiting, I am..."


