# **Being the Presence of God**

In just three days, Dicie Rue and I were privileged to attend two memorial services celebrating the lives of a church member and a former pastor. On Saturday, April 21, it

was for Sang Ok Cha, a petite, gracious South Korean lady and on Tuesday, April 24, it was for the Rev. Ben Read, affectionately known as "Gentle Ben." One was outdoors in the Tyler Rose Garden and the other was in the ornate, beautiful First UMC, Wichita Falls.

In Tyler we were joined by Wesley members and Sang Ok's dear friends, Wanda and Jimmy Winfrey. In Wichita Falls, Ben's friends and long time church members, Diane Dixon and Dorothy MCaig, joined us. It is always fitting and proper to honor those who have joined the Church Triumphant. It is both the Methodist Way and the Wesley Way of offering the ministry of presence with those whose lives mirror the Christian Way.

Times of grief and times of joy give each of us an opportunity to unite in a special ministry, The Ministry of Presence. Writer and Professor of Pastoral Care, the late Dr. Wayne E. Oates, once said, "Non-repetitive events take priority." By this, Dr. Oates meant events like funerals, memorial services, weddings, annual events (concerts, awards banquets, special celebrations of relatives, neighbors, close friends, employees, etc.). Faced with options on a daily basis, each of us has to choose those events that are more worthy of our time. I'll admit; even with this "non-repetitive events take priority" notion in my mind and heart, I still struggle to be present (be there!) at the right event at the right time. And I'll admit this; sometimes Dicie rue and I simply divide and conquer when faced with good choices for us. I'll go to one place or event and she'll go to another place or event. It is not the way we might choose on our own, but it is a way to be present for that special person in our lives1

In my message last Sunday, I used the term "practicing the presence of God." The most common way we, as Christian believers, emulate this idea is when we pray to God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Psalm 46:10 reminds me and us to "be still and know that I am God." It is a holy moment when we choose the spiritual discipline ore, as we Methodists, say a "means of grace." It matter not where your prayer closet may be, a designated prayer room, an office, a place in the woods or outdoors, sitting by a lake or on a seashore, or even while riding on a horse. on a lawn tractor, or in your truck or car, practicing the presence of God is that time you set aside purposely to share your words of concern, praise, joy, grief, or any emotion to "our God who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to Him be glory in the church and in Christ generations, forever and Jesus to all Amen." (Ephesians 3:20)

But practicing the presence of God is also an everyday choice you and I get to make. Scripture tells us to look out for one another as well as to love, pray, and serve one another. This is showing a deep concern for one another's well-being and spiritual and physical health. I hope I have corrected a comment I used to share with folk I visited or saw once in a while; "Yes, I'll sure be praying for you and I'll come and see you when I pass this way again!" It felt righteous and even good for me to say it, but then I did not always follow through with my words.

While on the road about 25 years ago, I believe the Holy Spirit convicted me of saying these words but not actually doing what I promised! I began to see the wrongness of saying one thing and then not doing it (following through). I think this was about the same time I was shaving one morning and I realized I was the only one that could confess this sin of omission! Now, I am very careful with my words to those whose paths I cross infrequently. And for those who ask me to pray for them, I ask immediately, "May I pray for you now?" I have never been turned down. I always find a place wherever I am to pray with and for anyone. It is a better way for me to practice the presence of God in real time.

If you haven't guessed by now, I often use the Affirmation of Faith of the United Church of Canada (UM Hymnal #883) which speaks directly to all of us. It declares our Trinitarian Faith (God in Three Persons) and reminds us "We are not alone and we live in God's world...in life, in death, in life beyond death, God is with us. We are not alone. Thanks be to God. Amen."


