

From Pastor Steve

April 2019 Ministry Vignettes: Holy Moments

Steve I have this small plaque in my office which says:

"Life is not measured by the number of breaths we take, but by the moments that take our breath away."

It greets me every day. It fills me with praise. It reminds me how blessed I am to serve our God in three persons: Blessed Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In return, I ask to "be a channel of blessing every day" to everyone I see or meet.

- 1. Our Chancel Choir really "blessed us real good" with their sharing the cantata, **Behold the Lamb**, Easter Sunday morning. In my five years at Wesley, I believe this was the finest presentation (yet) of our Chancel Choir directed by Joe Clark! If you were not here, you missed a holy moment. The singing and narration was "spot on!" At Wesley, we both speak and sing the Gospel truth in love.
- 2. Not only was there almost a full house for our Easter service, there was an overflowing house in our nursery. Fifteen babies, toddlers, and littles were presented to Mrs. Julie and Ms. Kara, so an "all points bulletin" (APB) was sent out for assistance and Mattie and Allie Thurman, (twins, Blue Blazes and superb volunteers) responded. I give thanks to God for all four ladies for their loving care of our babies and littles: Julie, Kara, Allie and Mattie—ya'll rock!
- 3. Wednesday, April 17, was filled with holy moments. A. The meal was a gift from our newest ministry, Breaking Bread Together (BBTM): salad, biscuits and gravy or butter, entrée of meat loaf, mashed potatoes, and green beans, and a fresh fruit cobbler topped with vanilla ice cream. B. This was a sit-down meal and gracious service throughout the meal was provided by our youth assisted by Joe Clark, Youth Director, and his mom, Gail Clark. I cannot express how amazing our youth served us we even tipped them! C. The annual Easter egg hunt had to be an inside event because of rain and wet weather. Well, outside or inside, Marieke deWitte, our Children's Minister, always is prepared to host this event. So, our sanctuary was transformed into a pasture to hide eggs. Not only that, but Marieke shared with our children "The Easter Story" and then concluded with craft time and candy (C & C time). And so many parents were here with their little ones observing "ministry on the spot." D. By the way, around 80 folk enjoyed the meal, the

gracious serving, the egg hunt and activities, and the cleanup once again, by our Breaking Bread Together Ministry team. (Besides these "holy moments," there were plenty of "special moments" as well!)

- 4. Our annual Good Friday service (April 19) is always a quiet, reflective time for people of faith. Scripture, candles, reading, music, and the removal of the Altar elements focus on Christ dying on the Cross for our sins. While we can never completely understand or explain the ways of our God, we can remember the sacrifice offered for each of us. Seven readers shared, from John's Gospel, the events that occurred on Good Friday. We left saying to one another, "It's Friday, but Sunday's coming!" Another holy moment.
- 5. Palm Sunday, on April 14, is always the beginning of Holy Week. This is when we remember the day Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey amid the cries of "Hosanna, blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest." To relate to this event, all who worship this day are given a palm branch to be placed on our rugged Cross. Our Holy Week begins similarly to the day Jesus rode into town as a Savior and not as a war hero. Within 5 days, those Hosannas were replaced with "Crucify Him! Crucify Him!" Once again, it is very difficult to wrap our minds around this "means of grace" for us. No wonder the Apostle Paul wrote from his own life as a Christ follower: "We walk by faith and not by sight." Even Jesus said, "Blessed are those who believe without seeing!"
- 6. Serving Communion to our Homebound and Shut-ins. I commend our senior ladies who faithfully alternate visiting these special members unable to be "in church" (our buildings) due to illness and declining health issues. This ministry preceded my ministry at Wesley, yet I receive reports each Monday from these special ladies concerning those visited and other words on people they encounter. To me, these ladies share with me Holy Moments (often, special, humorous encounters!) Sole gratia, Ladies! (By Grace alone)

Vignettes. Brief Reports. Special Moments. All = Holy Moments! Sole Gloria! (for the glory of God alone.) May we continue to be the presence of God wherever God leads us. Amen.
