Church Work Amidst COVID-19

The understatement of the Year: "We didn't need this Pandemic [COVID-19] and still be 'The Church!" As far as I know, no one asked for it. Everyone has suffered because of it. And yet, we are still "The Church."

From the very beginning, our Church Media Team quickly adjusted to a new form of worship for our Church: Online—Wesley Facebook. We first tried this different fork of worship in Wesley Hall, but the emptiness of our Fellowship Hall/Gym eventuated in sound echoes. So, realizing this, the Media Team suggested we move into The Wesleyan classroom and convert it to a worship setting. It worked! The 6-8 of us in charge of Worship enjoyed a new and vital working relationship. I even did my Mon/Wed/Fri "Words From Wesley in this setting.

And then we decided to move into a combination of Online and Live Worship back into Wesley Hall. Alleluia! We were first set up with the Pulpit area facing a basketball goal at the other end [long way] and then decided to set up with the Pulpit area adjacent to the outside wall of The Wesleyan Classroom looking toward The Choir Room. With the addition of various crosses made by Barbara Williams posted above the Pulpit area, we were in a different mode of worship, but always the same worship of God in Jesus Christ. Attendance has been around 50-60 folk gathering inside while a growing number of folk worshipping Online. [We even had a former member worshipping with us recently while in the Washington, DC area! Thank you for checking in with us David Stribling, Jr.]

And now, we are ready to return to our Sanctuary to worship on Sunday, October 4, 2020!

Let me say a "word of appreciation" to our Wesley Ladies who have cleaned our Sanctuary quite thoroughly the past few days. Rhonda Alley has led this volunteer effort assisted by Rachel Lewis, Betty Phillips, Barbara Williams, Mary Ellen Kirkland as well as Church Secretary, Bonnie Gilmer. [Rhonda started her cleaning by herself last week! Many thanks!] The additional ladies spent most of today, September 22nd, working as The Sanctuary Cleanup Team. To each of you, thanks and God bless you!

We have learned over the years that The Church is not just a building, but really The People of God living and working as a Team. As the limerick many of us learned years ago "The Church is not The Steeple, but is really The People." As we respond to the Grace of God and saying Yes I believe Jesus is the Son of God and my Savior, we are responding to God's Saving Grace. When we declare we are Followers of Jesus Christ, we are then experiencing God's Sanctifying Grace ["Growing in the Grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ. It is a Prevenient Grace that is offered to us by God before we even realize it. God has been with us all along. When we say "Yes" to God in Jesus Christ, it a converting Grace. Salvation is the result. We are transformed and become Believers and Disciples [Followers]. For the rest of our lives on earth, we are experiencing God's Sanctifying Grace.

And how do we experience Sanctifying Grace? [Glad you asked!] By practicing The Means of Grace as experienced in the following ways: Works of Piety = Prayer, sharing Communion,

searching the Scriptures [Bible Study; Sunday School]; Fasting, and attending Christian gatherings [conferences; meetings]. We also "grow in the Grace of God by practicing "Works of Mercy" such as Visiting in nursing homes, jails, and private homes; Feeding the Hungry; Clothing the Naked; delivering Meals and other needs to sick, elderly, and hurting and suffering folk; and really offering any type of assistance to folk in times of need.

In reality, the "Means of Grace' [whether Works of Piety or Works of Mercy] are outward signs, words, or actions given to us by God and are ordinary channels whereby we might convey to all folk the Preventing, Justifying [Converting], and Sanctifying Grace of God. These differing yet united Means of Grace as understood by John Wesley, our spiritual father, act as the ONE Grace of God. Wesley added: "(1)God is above all means; (2)There is no power in the Means; (3)they are not meritorious; (4)Grace is dispensed by the power of God's Holy Spirit and the merits of His Son, Jesus Christ; and (5)Seek God alone.

As The Church known as Wesley United Methodist, we are at work at ALL times as The Body of Christ. When one hurts, we all hurt. When one excels, we rejoice in their rewarded effort. When we are in need, we practice both The Works of Mercy and The Works of Piety—for whatever need(s) our sisters and brothers in Christ are facing. I cannot say it enough: "WE are The Church!"

So, we'll gather as The Church back in our Sanctuary the first Sunday in October 4, 2020. For months, it has felt [for some] like an Exile. And that is an appropriate, biblical model. And I rejoice that NO MATTER WHAT OR WHERE, God is WITH US. He loves each of us the same. Through The Son of God, Jesus the Christ, we have been saved, we were saved, and we will be saved. In the meantime, let these words from The Apostle Paul guide us:

"For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature. Shall be able to separate us from the Love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord." [Romans 8:38-39]
