Lent

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday (February 17, 2021), and ends on Holy Saturday (April 3). Lent comes Anglo Saxon word from the lencten, meaning "lengthen" and

refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin His ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Today, Christians focus on relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter." This is why you will see the designation "Sunday in Lent" rather than "Sunday of Lent" in the naming of these Sundays. On each Lord's Day in Lent, while Lenten fasts continue, the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

From Pastor Steve

Plodding along in holiness

Taking long trips with children or extended family often grow old before reaching his/her destination (beach, nation-

al or state park, museums and historical sites, etc.). Most of us think these words although we may resist saying them, "Are we there yet?" Often, they are just said without thought!

At Wesley, and all Protestant/Christian churches), we are halfway through our **2021 journey of Lent.** The Scriptures I have been using in my Lenten preaching have all been from **The Revised Common Lectionary**, specifically chose Biblical sections from 4 sources (two from each the Old and New Testaments.). I opt to use one from each of the Testaments, although 4 are offered each Sunday, 1 from Psalms and the other from anywhere else in the Old Testament, and 1 from the Gospels and the other from anywhere else in the New Testament. Especially during **Lent**, Scriptures are tied together to help us maintain a focus and **Lent**.

Lent is a Christian season and an individual journey comprising 40 days. The number 40 reflects the number of days Jesus confronted Satan, the Devil, in the Wilderness. Luke 4:1-13 gives the larger experience of Jesus with Satan. However, it is Matthew 4:1-11 that declares Jesus fasted forty days and forty nights. This notion of fasting has become the emphasis over the years of what the journey of Lent represents - until we get to Holy Week - Palm Sunday-**Easter Sunday**. For whatever purpose, most Christian believers seem to gravitate toward giving up foods such as chocolate, candy, meats, etc., drinks, such as coffee, tea, wine, etc., or losing weight. Perhaps, these are important first steps on this journey, but perhaps we should be giving up biases, prejudices, untruths, sarcasm, hurtful comments, and harboring grudges and grievances. These are attitudes and aptitudes of our heads and our hearts. "God helping us," and through our personal times alone at home or work or alone in our vehicles, we can proclaim a **FAST** to overcome these afflictions. "Cast your cares on Him, for He cares about you.

During the mid-eighteenth century, it the Methodist Church that lead in a Holiness of Heart and Life Revival. Holiness, is the Doctrine of Sanctification. It is from St. Paul's words that note as Christians, we being saved daily as we practice Wesley's Works of Piety which are reading, meditating the Scriptures, prayer, fasting, regularly attending worship, healthy living, and sharing our faith, etc., and his Works of Mercy which include doing good works to all, visiting the sick, visiting those in prison, feeding the hungry, and giving generously to the needs of others, etc.

These two types of works are the **Means of Grace** whereby God in Christ provides ways we mature in our faith in the walk of **Sanctification**. Recall the Apostle Paul's words in Philippians: "Work out your own salvation in Jesus Christ." Like an unattended flower or plant, should we decide we have arrived at perfection, we will die for lack of attending to the ways we CAN grow. Ultimately, it is a personal decision to stop growing or even having the desire to stop. My hope for us is that we commit at least to **plod along in holiness of heart and life!**. **Amen.**

Governor Greg Abbott has appointed Emily Glass and reappointed Kirby Hollingsworth to the Sulphur River Basin Authority Board of Directors for a term set to expire on Feb. 1, 2027.

The board has the responsibility to construct, maintain, and operate inside the state and in the watershed of the Sulphur River and its tributaries inside or outside the boundaries of the authority any works considered essential to the operation and for its administration in controlling, storing, preserving, and distributing the water off the Sulphur River and its tributary streams, including the storm water and floodwater.
