“The Pandemic of the Soul!”

Here we go again! Yet another round of **COVID-19**. This particular variant is called **Delta**. In all honesty, most of us are where King David was in Psalm 39:9-11; 22.

“O Lord, all my longing is known to you; my sighing is not hidden from you. My heart throbs, my strength fails me; as for the light of my eyes—it is also gone from me. My friends and companions stand aloof from my affliction, and my neighbors stand far off...do not forsake me, O Lord; O my God, do not be far from me; make haste to help me, O Lord, my salvation.”

In the midst of constant medical announcements and updates, we have learned to either listen and respond positively or negatively or simply turn a deaf ear to all forms of media. I confess there have been times when I just wanted to enjoy a time of peace and comfort away from all of the pandemic-related news, the forest fires in the west, the floods in Europe, assassinations of leaders in nations, political ping pong gamesmanship in our own country, and the great divide that has existed forever between the have and have-nots!

Now there has been a record number of fights aboard airlines, pushing and shoving in handout lines for food, and intentional name-calling and derogatory, nicknaming of our elected leaders by other elected leaders. I am convinced we have lost our sense of decency and respect for one another and it is played out over forms of media we use: internet, tv, radio, i-phone, etc.

I have said consistently for years that what happens on Main Street, USA will make its way into all local churches—small and large. This means when we arrive for worship on any Sunday morning, we have endured a constant replay of the negative and the rumor-mongering game for the preceding 6 days. Instead of us arriving to be filled with the Spirit of God in searching the Scriptures, we are much more likely to be replaying the preceding week’s news and often applying our opinion or viewpoint of our daily life in the USA. A result is our being weighed down by all the news noise obviously filtered through media viewpoints. Whom can we trust to speak the truth? Whom can we befriend to interpret and/or explain the best way to respond with integrity?

The Pandemic of the Soul affects all living beings. Our Christian faith is one of **The Three H’s: Head, heart and hands**. To be born anew, born again, or saved is an experience prompted by the Holy Spirit. **Romans 10:8-10; 13** declares:

“But what does the Scripture say? The Word (of God) is near you, and on your lips and in your heart (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For one believes with the heart and is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved...everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.”

When human beings are prohibited from living their normal daily lifestyle—whatever it may be—then there are losses of freedoms that negatively affect his or her emotions and well-being. Normal routines such as shopping, walking, visiting family, friends or neighbors stop. Suddenly, our heads, hearts, and hands are unable to do or go. Most often, an unsettling fear accompanies these

losses. Confusion may result. Hugs and touches may stop. We see one another, yet we cannot enter into each other’s space—even at church much less family! We feel helpless to help ourselves and others. The joy of living is suspended.

Pandemic is defined as “an event in which a disease spreads across several countries and affects a large number of people.”

It is a challenge to offer a way of having being church during a pandemic. Wesley had to offer first a drive-in church in our parking lot., then online with less than ten of us as worship leaders, then wearing masks and encouraging members and guests to join the worship team in Wesley Hall (still online), and finally returning to our sanctuary while still wearing masks at first, and then without masks (and online!).

It was a glorious day when our Sanctuary Choir finally rejoined our Sunday worship! We had to offer Communion in a different way without fingers touching the bread or the juice. We have followed guideline given to us by our Bishop and the CDC (Centers for Disease Control). We chose to relocate our Church nursery to Wesley Hall until we deemed it safe to return to the shared space with our Little Acorn School folk. **Continuous change** has been the operative phrase. All of the this affects **The Pandemic of the Soul**.

It is noteworthy that Jesus spoke these words to his Disciples in Matthew 11:

V. 27: All things have been handed over to me by my Father; and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and ANYONE to whom the Son chooses to reveal him. V. 28 “Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. V. 30 “For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.”

Psalm 55:22a reminds all of us to **“Cast your burden on the Lord and the Lord will sustain you.”** Hebrews 13:5b is a repeat of Deuteronomy 31:8 and is the source of our help in time of need:

“I will never leave you nor forsake you.”

May we always remember our God is our Creator God who is **“with us always.”** (1 Peter 5:7) In Jesus Christ, we have been adopted as sons and daughters in the Family of God, forgiven of our sins, and make new by the power of the Holy Spirit.

The hymn, “The Lily of the Valley” sings it well for us:

He will never, never leave me, nor yet forsake me here, while I live by faith and do his blessed will; A wall of fire about me, I’ve nothing now to fear, with His manna my hungry soul shall fill.

God is good, all the time, and all the time, God is good.

The Ad Board met on Tuesday, July 27, and discussed the church finances at length. The decision was made to ask the Trustees to request some of our money being held in the Texas Methodist Foundation be moved into our general fund. This money has been held there as a "back up" for major rainy day expenses, but will instead be used to help cover monthly utilities, insurance and salaries. The church cannot be sustained long term with these funds. Please understand that this is an action taken with heavy hearts. Giving is down considerably, and is NOT covering our expenses. The sale of the church bus is also on the next Trustee agenda. The Ad Board will be meeting again on Tuesday, August 31, to discuss more options. All members are welcome to attend. Some difficult decisions will need to be made to keep Wesley moving forward.

MANY fundraising options have been discussed and approved. Some are in-house fundraisers and others have us moving into the public. There are SEVERAL participation options available for our members. Please check the big bulletin board in Wesley Hall and sign your name on one or more of the papers that Emily Glass has posted. YOUR time and talent are needed.

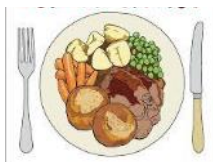
